In the name of the benevolent Father of all
I Ebenezer Osborn of the County of Hamilton
and State of Indiana do make and publish
this my last will and testament.

Item I do give and devise to my beloved wife
in lieu of her interest in my Real Estate all my
personal Estate during her natural life and all the
Stock household goods furniture provisions and other
goods and chattles which may be in my possession
at the time of my decease together with all the
moneys I may have on hand or may be due during
her natural life as aforesaid. personal property or
the proceeds thereof as will pay my just debts, at that Death of my said
wife the aforesaid personal property or the proceeds
thereof as may then remain unconsumed and expended
I give and direct to be equally divided between

my Children and the heirs forever namely
Mary Osborn now wife of Joseph Osborn
Anna Osborn now wife of John Heles Michael Osborn
now wife of Doctor Bartlett B D Osborn & John Osborn
And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my
son John Osborn. Executor of this my last Will and
Testament hereby authorizing and empowering to
Compromise adjust and release and discharge in
such manner as he may deem proper the debts and
Claims due me I do also authorize and empower him
if it shall be necessary in order ~~that~~ to pay my debts to
set off of private or in such manner upon such
Terms of credit or otherwise as he may think proper.



Be it Remembered.

That on the 5th day of October 1866 William
Beck one of the subscribing witnesses to the
within and foregoing last will and testament
of Ebenezer Osborn late of said County deposed
personally before William W. Corner Clerk of the
Court of Common Pleas of Hamilton County, in
the State of Indiana. and being duly sworn
by the Clerk of said Court upon his oath de-
posed and testified as follows, that is to say:
that on the 15th day of March 1855 he saw the
said Ebenezer Osborn sign his name to said
instrument in writing as and for his last
will and testament, and that this deponent at
the same time heard the said Ebenezer Osborn
declare the said instrument in writing to
be his last will and testament, and that
the said instrument in writing was at
the same time, at the request of said Ebenezer
Osborn, and with his consent attested and
subscribed by the said William Beck and Jacob
Ganest in the presence of the said Testator, and
in the presence of each other as subscribing
witnesses thereto, and that the said Ebenezer
Osborn was at the time of the signing and

Subscribing of the said instrument in writing as aforesaid, of full age, (that is, more than twenty-one years of age) and of sound and disposing mind and memory, and not under any coercion or restraint, as the said deponent verily believes; and further deponent says not Wm. Beck.
