State of Indiana Parke county I Be it remembered that on this day to wit, the 30th day of January A. D. 1835. Before me the undersigned clerk of the Probate court in and for said county personally came Mary Rusey formerly Mary Pateaway one of the subscribing witnesses to the within last will & testament of Richard Taylor late of said county deceased and made oath that she saw the said testator sign and seal the said will, that she heard him publicly declare the same to be his last will & testament that at the time of the execution thereof the said testator was of sound and disposing mind memory & understanding and that she signed her name thereto as a witness in the presence of the said testator and in the presence of each other, and at his request. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

The will by word of mouth of Jesse Osborn late of the County of Parke, State of Indiana deceased as published & declared by him on the twenty third day of August eighteen hundred and thirty five in presence of us James Woody and William Brown who were present & witnessed the publishing and declaring thereof by the said testator that is to say I will and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Osborn, the Land & farm on which I reside with full possession thereof, until my children shall arrive at the age of twenty one years after which time, my will & bein is that she shall have one third thereof and of the proceeds arising therefrom, whilst she remains my widow, and she is authorized and requested to keep all such personal property as she may see proper for the support of herself and children, and the balance of my personal property to be sold and the proceeds thereof retained for the benefit of my children, And I do choose and appoint Isaac Hobson Jr. of said County to be executor of this my will. In testimony whereof we the said James Woody & William Brown have

to the within instrument of writing purporting to
be the last will and testament of Jesse Osborn
deceased; & solemnly and sincerely affirmed that
they heard the testator therein named publicly
declare the same to be his last Will & testament
that at the time of the making & publishing
thereof he was of sound and disposing mind
memory and understanding, that the same was made
in the last sickness of the said testator, and by
them committed to writing within fifteen days after
the making thereof, and that they were in effect
called upon by the said testator to witness the same
