I Daniel Osborn, In the name of God & man, of the Town of _____ County of Wayne and State of Indiana, Being of sound mind, do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form, Viz, That is to say, I give the use of my home place, I purchased of my son Daniel Osborn to my wife Jane, during her natural life - Further I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Osborn One Hundred dollar - I give and bequeath to my son George Osborn One Hundred dollar - I Give and bequeath all the residue of all my estate both real and personal, to be divided equally between the seven youngest of my children, to have their heirs and assigns forever -

That ~~is~~ my intention, and memory is, that all my real and personal estate is to be divided equally among between George Osborn Abigail Osborn Levina Whitehead, Samuel Osborn, Jane Butler, Hetfield Osborn & Maria Osborn, to them their heirs & assigns forever. Lastly, I constitute and appoint my son George Osborn & Samuel Osborn Executors to this my last will and testament, in testimony whereof I have ~~unto~~ set my hand & seal this 8th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

& thirty six, signed sealed and in the presence
of these witnesses as well as they have signed
their ^{several} names in my presence. I give my great
Bible to my son Daniel Osborn.

John Scott dec. Will. I John Scott of the County of Wayne in the State of Indiana, do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

Item First; I direct that my body be decently interred and that my funeral charges and all my just debts be paid as soon after my decease as practicable, out of the first monies that shall come into the hands of my executors from any portion of my real estate, real or personal.

Item Second; I direct that the first part of my now live on, and all my personal property be given to my beloved wife Rachael during her widowhood, and when she ceases to be my widow, then I direct that all my personal property, real estate and monies be appraised and sold at public sale, and the money to be divided as follows, that my two grand daughters Margaret and Patsy Maggatt who are living with us, to have a bed and clothing each and fifty Dollars, also provided they shall stay with their grandmother until they are 18 years
