has paid herself for any money she paye for me, with
her Brother John S. Osborne and David Osborne

In the name of God Amen I Isaac boldwell of the County of
Bourbon and State of Kentucky being far advanced in life and
fast approaching my later end tho' in a common state of
health and strength of mind do make and publish this my last
will and Testament in the manner and form following to wit
First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rachel boldwell
the use of the plantation which I now live on for her maintain-
ance and support during her natural life and at her death
the land is to descend to her grandson John Sump who now
lives with me upon condition that he the said John Sump
shall when he gets possession of the land pay one half of the
value thereof to Isaac Swright Andrew Swright and David
Swright sons of William Swright in the following manner
to be divided equally amongst them and to be paid in the
following kind of property horses cattle hogs wheat or whiskey
I will to receive his part one year after said Sump shall get
possession Andrew two years after and David three years after if
they shall at that time be twenty one years of age I also will
and bequeath to my wife Rachel all the moveable property I may
at possession of and for her use during her life and at her death
the said personal property or any increase that may be made
thereunto shall be sold and the one half shall descend to John
Sump and other half to the above named three boys to wit
Isaac Andrew and David I also do appoint James Robison
