In the name of God Amen this 20 Day of
January Anno Domini 1780 I Catherine Corn
of Charles County in the province of Maryland being of law
State of health but of perfect mind and memory, praised
be to God for the same do hereby ordain constitute
and appoint this my last Will and Testament, Revoking
and disannulling all former Wills by me heretofore
made in anywise ordaining constituting and appointing
my Brother David Corn and Brother Thomas Corn
my lawful true heirs and for the more exact and punctual
performance hereof - Inprimis, I commend my
soul to Almighty God, hoping assuredly through the
merits of my Redeemer to be partaker of life ever-
lasting and I commend my body to the Earth Dust of

In the name of God Amen I William Boorman of Charles County County of Va. but of sound and perfect Memory do make and obtain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following - First of all I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God and my body to the Earth to be buried a decent Christian Buriall at the Discretion of my Executors. I do give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved Wife Dorothy Boorman do have the use of the whole of my Estate during her single life excepting one horse sold for me this Spring by my Son John Florence with one cow one Heifer and one yearling, I give to my Son William Boorman I give and bequeath unto my Son Egbertus Boorman
