In the name of God Amen. I Anna Hall of Ken-
nolunk in the County of York, widow, being desirous to
settle my worldly affairs, while I have strength and capacity
so to do, do hereby make and publish this my last will
and testament in manner following viz.

First. I order all my just debts and funeral expenses to
be paid.

Second. I give to each of my grand-children, the children
of my deceased daughter Rachel Francis Osborn, late wife
of Ebenezer F. Osborn Esq. of Sandusky, Ohio, hereinafter named
to wit; Anna Lou Osborn, Elizabeth Francis Osborn John Lou
Osborn, George Lewis Osborn, Francis Hall Osborn, Mary Ann
Osborn and Ellen Augusta Osborn, the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Third. I give to each of my grand-children, the
children of my son John Lou Grant of Alfred, hereafter named
to wit; Edward Francis Grant, Ebenezer Francis Grant, Laura
Anna Grant, John Lou Grant, Elizabeth Bowditch Grant,
Nathan Appleton Grant, George Wells Grant, and Jane
Patterson Grant, the sum of Fifty dollars.

Fourth. I give to Rebecca Littlefield of Kennolunk the
sum of Fifty dollars; all the foregoing legacies to
be paid by my executor hereinafter named.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my said son John Lou Grant
all my household Furniture, and other goods which I may
have in my house.

Sixth. All the rest and residue of my Estate both real and
personal I give and devise to Nathan D. Appleton of Alfred
to have and to hold the same in trust; the said Trustee
to pay over the net amount of the interest, rents and
income thereof, after deducting all taxes and other necessary

charges and expenses, to my said son J. L. Grant annually, during his life, and after his decease, the same to be divided and distributed equally among his children and legal heirs.

And I hereby authorize and empower the said Trustee if he shall judge it expedient and beneficial for all interested, to sell and convey the said real estate at public or private sale, and the proceeds to invest in good stock, or put out at interest on good security. The interest or income thereof to be paid over annually as before directed to said J. L. Grant and at his decease, the principal to be divided and distributed among his children and heirs at Law

And I hereby constitute and appoint ~~William D.~~ Nathan D. Appleton of Alfred to be executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me, before made. In witness ^{whereof} I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of August A. D. 1852. Signed, sealed, published and declared by the said Anna Hall to be her last will and testament in our presence, who here signed the same in her presence, and in the presence of each other as witnesses thereto.

Kennebunk March 31, 1853 -

I Anna Hall of Kennebunk do make this present
codicil, which I order and direct shall be taken as and for
part of the foregoing last will and testament made by me
and bearing date August 28th 1852. I do hereby ratify and
confirm said will, save so far, as any part thereof shall be al-
tered by this Codicil -

I give to Misses Plummer Grant, the youngest
child of my son John Lee Grant, the sum of fifty dollars
to be paid him by my Executor -

I hereby order and direct, that, if Laura Jane Grant, the
present wife of my said son John Lee Grant, shall survive
her said husband, the trustee named in said Will, shall
pay over to said Laura Jane, after her said husband's death,
annually, one third part of the net amount of the interest
rents and income of my estate in his hands, during her
natural life; and the remaining two thirds of said interest
rents & income, are to be paid over to the children & heirs at
law of said John L. Grant, during the period ~~the~~ the said Laura
Jane may survive her said husband, and at her decease, the
estate devised and bequeathed ~~to her~~ in Trust, to the trustee
named in said Will, shall be divided and distributed among
the children and heirs at Law of said John Lee Grant -
