In the name of God Amen. I
Catharine Osburn of the Township of
Franklin County of Bergen and State of
New Jersey. being of sound mind memory
and understanding. praised be God for it
and Considering the Certainty of death and
to the end I may be the better prepared to
leave the world, whenever it shall please
God to call me hence, do therefore make
and declare this my last will and Testa-
ment. in manner following, First and
principally I Commit my soul to Almi-
ghty God my Creator Hoping for the pardon
and Remission of all my sins through
Jesus Christ my Saviour. my Body I
Commit to the Earth and as to such
worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to Intrust me I dispose of the same
as follows... First it is my will and
I do hereby Order. that all my just debts
if any there should be after my decease and
all my funeral expenses & the Cost of
erecting a Tomb stone to my memory. be
first paid by my Executors herein after
named out of my personal estate.

I give and bequeath unto my son
John the Sum of Twenty dollars
and the residue and remainder of my
personal estate goods & chattles of what
kind and nature soever I give and
bequeath unto my three daughters viz
Margaret (widow of Daniel Satter), Adaline
wife of Joseph Post. and Polly wife of
John P Debaun to be divided equally
among them share & share alike

And lastly I do hereby appoint my son in
Law. John P Debaun and Abraham J Aker-
man. Executors of this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all former Wills
by me made. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this Thir-
tieth day of January One thousand eight
hundred and Forty Five

declared by the testator to be
her last Will and Testament
in the presence of us who
