

and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Dye, I Do make and ordain this my Last will and testament
That is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it
And for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discre-
tion of Executors nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty
power of gods and as Touching such worldly Estate Wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this Life I give
Devise and Dispose of the same in the following Manner, and form, Inprimis I give and bequeath unto my
Well beloved Brother Nathaniel Osborne all my Land only my Wifes part During his Life time, and
and then I give and bequeath all that Land to philip godfree eldest Son of philip godfree but then I ord-
er the said philip godfree Juner to pay unto his brother Nathaniel Godfree fifty pound of good and Lawfull
Money When Ever the said philip godfree Comes to have the land also I give one half of my movable
Estat to my brother Nathaniel Osborne as well as the land his Life time, If then I give to my well beloved Sister
Truth godfree the other half of my movable Estat and so for the same to be Divided Equely between
my brother and sister also I give and bequeath twenty pound of good and Lawfull money of west
Jersey unto Daniel Smith Junior the Son of Jeremiah Smith and if Daniel Smith should Dye before
he should Come of age then I order the same Sum of twenty pound to become Jessy Smith the said
Son of Jeremiah Smith and if Jessy Smith should Dye before he Comes of age then the same Sum
of twenty pound in like manner as before shall becom and fall to James Smith his brother
whather more I Direct my brother and Law philip godfree and my Curzen David Smith to
by my Lawfull Executors also first of all I Direct the Executors to pay the said Sum of twenty
pound as before mentioned unto Daniel Smith Junior or to Jessy Smith if he the said Daniel
Smith should Dye or to James Smith if Jessy Smith should Dye When they Come of age to Each
or Either of which Ever it blong to Now my worldly affairs being fully Settled and ordaned
