In the Name of God Amen I Annasha of born of
the County of Capenay in the Province of New Jersey
Gentleman being very sick but by Gods mercy
of sound and Dispersing mind and memory and
knowing the Certainty of Death Do make and ordain
this my Last Will and Testament. First I
Recommend my soul to the mercy of God In humble
Hopes of his Blessing thro the Merits of the Righteous
Redeemer, Touching my Worldly Estate My will
is as Follows. — In primis I hereby Give
Devise and ~~Bequeath~~ All and Singular my Real
and Personal Estate (with the Hereditaments and
appurtenances therunto belonging) whereof I shall
Die Seized unto my Dearly beloved Daughter
Mary Garrison wife of Daniel Garrison Junior
To Hold to my said Daughter Mary her heirs and
assigns to her and their sole and only use forever.
Subject Nevertheless to the following Limitations
and conditions That is to say That ~~if~~ ⁱⁿ ~~case~~ she
my said Daughter Mary Her Heirs Executors or
Administrators Do Pay the Four Legacies ~~next~~
hereafter named viz. First that within one year
after my Decease she my said Daughter Mary, her
heirs Executors or Administrators do Pay the
Sum of Ninety Pounds proclamation money (as a
Legacy Issuing out of my said Estate) to my Dearly
beloved Daughter Phebe Edwards her Executors or
Administrators: which I hereby Give to my said

Daughter Phebe. Secondly To my Granddaughter
Hannah I like the sum of Thirty pounds of like
money aforesaid which I order the Executors of this
my Will to place at Interest within Three years
after my Decease for the benefit of the said Hannah
and keep the same at Interest on good security
until she attains the age of Eighteen years. on which
Day I order my Executors to pay her the said ~~Thirty~~ ^{thirty} pound
with the neat proceeds of Interest which shall then
have arisen thereon. But if she shall die before she
attains the age of Eighteen years and shall leave living
Lawful Issue of her Body I give the same to such Issue
But if the said Hannah shall die before she is Eighteen
years of age without leaving living Lawful Issue of her
Body I then give the said Thirty pounds with the said
Interest unto my Daughters Mary and Phebe to be
Equally Divided between them their Executors or administrators ^{lawfully} ~~lawfully~~

Thirdly To my Grandson Stephen Smith the sum of Thirty
Pounds like money aforesaid as a Legacy Issuing out of
my said Estate which I Give unto him and order my
Executors to place the same at Interest within Three
years after my Decease for his benefit and keep the same
at Interest on good security until he attains the age
of Twenty one years on which day I order my Executors
to pay him the said Thirty pounds with the neat proceeds
of the Interest which I give unto him. And Fourthly
To my Grandson Ananias Smith the sum of Thirty
pounds like money aforesaid as a Legacy Issuing out of
my said Estate and order my Executors to place the same
at Interest within Three years after my Decease for
his benefit and keep the same at Interest on good
security until he attains the age of Twenty one years
on which Day I order my Executors to pay him the said
Thirty pounds with the neat proceeds of the Interest
which I Give unto him. But if either of my said Grandsons

Stephen or Annanias should die without attaining the
 age of Twenty one years, and without leaving living lawful
 Issue of their body respectively then my will is that the
 Legacy aforesaid of such Deceased Grandson do go to
 my said Daughters Mary and Phebe to be Equally
 Divided between them, their Executors or administrators
 respectively Item It is my will that my said Daughter
 Mary be not obliged to pay the said Legacies to my said
 Grandchildren or any Interest thereon in less time than
 three years after my Decease. Item It is my will that
 out of my said Estate my said Daughter Mary do pay
 all my Debts, funeral Charges; and Charges of adminis-
 tration. Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my said
 Daughter Mary Garrison, the Executrix and her husband
 Daniel Garrison Junior the Executor of this my Last will
 and Testament And also Thomas Learning Esq^r one of the
 Executors thereof if he pleases and if he neglects or refuses
 then I appoint Mr. Jesse Hand one of the Executors
 thereof If he pleases. In Witness whereof I the said
 Annanias of born have to this my Last will and
 Testament set my hand and Seal this Twenty Second
 Day of January In the year of Our Lord One thousand
 Seven hundred and Seventy Two Hereby revoking
 all former wills and Testaments by me executed or
 made

 Declared by the said Annanias
 of born the Testator, as and for
 his Last Will and Testament,
 In the Presence of us who were
 Present at the Signing and Sealing
 thereof.
