I, Elias Osborn of the Township of Orange
in the County of Essex & State of New Jersey
being in a very infirm state of health & sensible
too of my liability to sudden death at the same
time being in my own apprehension of sound mind
do judge it best to make & accordingly do hereby
make this my last will & testament.

It is my will that all of my just debts & the charg-
-es of my funeral be paid & discharged by my exec-
-utors together with the expence of erecting two head-
-stones one for myself & one for my second wife
be paid & discharged by my executors hereinafter
named & appointed out of my estate as soon as
conveniently may be after my decease, and I leave
the Charges of my funeral & the erection of said head-
-stones to the direction of my said executors

I give and grant to my said executors full power
to grant & sell all my real estate for such con-
-sideration as to my executors shall seem reasonable,
and to make & duly execute any deed or instrument
they shall judge proper for the purpose and
my will is that they sell the same as soon as
they can to advantage after my decease & the money

arising by the sale to be by them disposed of agree-
able to my will herein expressed

I give to my son Simeon & to his heirs five dollars

I give to Harriet the daughter of my son Simeon
and to her heirs ten dollars

I give to each of my two daughters Phoebe & Hannah
a bed & bedding to their heirs respectively

I give to my son Thomas H. Osborn & to his heirs
forty dollars

I give to my daughter Sally Ballard & to her heirs
forty dollars. After paying the above mentioned debts & legacies then

The residue & remainder of all my estate after
first paying a debt due my wife for the sum
of fifty dollars together with interest on the same
from the month of April in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty five it
being for money borrowed of her at that time
for which she does not hold a note & it is my
will that it be paid out of my estate by my ex-
ecutors I give & grant in manner following that
is to say I give two fifths thereof to daughters Phoebe
& Hannah & my son Silas Osborn in equal shares
and proportions, & so to their respective heirs forever.

I give one fifth part thereof to my son Dennis
and to his heirs

I give one fifth thereof to my daughter Dorcas
and to her heirs Provided her husband ^{Daniel}
Jaquis shall first indemnify my estate against a cer-
tain note of fifty ^{dollars} P. P. (and security
for him) to the satisfaction of my executors
otherwise in case of his refusing so to indemnify,
it is my will that said sum be deducted from
her share together with whatever interest may
be due on the same

It is my will that the remaining fifth part
of my estate be put to interest by my executors
until the youngest son of my son Henry deceased,
arrives of age & it is my will that the interest
arising on the same during said time be shared
equally between my daughter Sally & Elias the
oldest son of my son Thomas J. Osborn & so by
their respective heirs said sum to be secured
by a mortgage or what my executors shall deem
good security & my will is that the principal
of said remaining one fifth part be equally divided
between the said children of my son Henry deceased
or the survivors or survivor of them & their heirs respect-
fully or in case of the death of the youngest of said children
at such time as he if living would have arrived at
the age of twenty one years

And I hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my son Dennis Osborn & my nephew John
S. Osborn jointly & severally executors of this my
last will & testament, and so that in the case
of the death of one of them, the survivor of
them shall then be sole executor of this my
said will. & I give to such survivor all the
power & direction I have given my said
executors. I also give to each of them all the
power, and repose in each of them all and
every trust I have given to them jointly,
provided, and so far as he shall act, shall
have the consent of the other executor, and
it is my will that neither of executors shall
be answerable for any of my estate received or
to be received by the other executor

In witness whereof, I have hereunto put my hand and
seal & publish & declare this to be my last will
and testament this nineteenth day of February in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and twenty eight


