ally divided between Elizabeth all Dickson
Abby L. Scott Mary M. Johnson and Mary
D. Bond above named - share & share alike Equ-
ally divided between them

Item I do hereby give to my Grand Daughter
Mary C Johnson one feather bed, bedding
bolsters and Pillow support for one bed

Item I do hereby give and bequeath unto my
Daughter & to my Grand daughter Mary M
Johnson & Mary D. Bond all the Rest of my
beds and bedding & to be Equally divided
between them share and share alike - and
I do hereby give to Mary M Johnson my Daugh-
ter my Eight day clock & my Ward Robe that
I lately bought to her & her heirs

Item all the Residue of my Property not here before
given away I do hereby give and bequeath unto
Mary M Johnson my Daughter and to my Grand
children the Children of Rebecca bond deceased the
one half to all the Johnson and the other half

to the children of Rebecca Bond dec'd. the said half
to be equally divided between the said children

Item It is my will and do direct that any legacy
I have given to any Grand child, and he or
she not being of a lawful age. the same shall
be held and kept by my Daughter Mary El
Johnson as a trustee for such child under age
and to be given to her or him at her own will
& pleasure - but not longer than to become of
lawful age -

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
