are held and firmly bound unto *Richard Howell Esq.*
Ordinary or Surrogate-General of the said State, in the Sum of *one hundred*
Richard Howell Esq. Pounds, lawful Money of said State, to be paid to the said
and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators,
jointly and severally, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals, and dated the
seventeenth Day of *June* - Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred
and *ninety nine*

THE Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the above bound
Daniel Hart
Administator of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, and Credits of *Peter*
Osborn late of the County of *Essex* deceased, do make or cause to
be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, and Credits
of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the Hands, Possession, or Knowledge
of the said *Daniel Hart*
or into the Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for
the said *Daniel Hart*
and the same so made do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the Registry
of the Prerogative Court, in the Secretary's Office of this State, at or before the Ex-
piration of six calendar Months, from the Date of the above-written Obligation, and
the same Goods, Chattels, and Credits, and all other Goods, Chattels, and Credits of
the said Deceased, at the Time of *his* Death, which at any Time after shall come to
the Hands or Possession of the said *Daniel Hart*
or into the Hands or Possession of any other Person
or Persons for the said *Daniel Hart*
do well and truly administer according to Law; and further,
do make or cause to be made a just and true Account of *his* Administration,
within twelve calendar Months from the Date of the above-written Obligation; and
all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattels, and Credits, which shall be
found remaining upon the Account of the said Administration, the same being first
examined and allowed of by the Judges of the Orphan's Court of the County, or
other competent Authority, shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons re-
spectively, who is, are, or shall by Law be entitled to receive the same. And if it shall
hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the said Deceased,
and the Executor or Executors therein named, or any other Person or Persons, do ex-
hibit the same into the said Prerogative Court, making Request to have it allowed
and approved; if the said *Daniel Hart*
being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said
Letters of Administration, (Approbation of such Testament being first had and
made) to the said Court, then the above Obligation to be void and of none Effect,
or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
