Mary Osbon.

In the name of God Amen.

I Mary Osbon of the town of Bethlehem county
of Hunterdon and state of New Jersey do give ~~and~~
to each of my sons ~~Smith~~, John, Samuel, William
Benajah and Daniel, also to each of my daughters
Rebecca, ~~and~~ Pamela and Nancy one sett of half dozen
common table spoons, all of whom have received
them except Pamela, Daniel, and Nancy who are to
receive them hereafter. I do also give to my youngest son
Ziba one sett of the table spoons above mentioned. It is
my intention and wish that ~~my~~ ^{son} just debts be paid first.
I do give to my daughter Nancy and ^{son} Ziba the residue
of my property to be equally divided between them
for and in consideration of their care and attention
during my lingering state of sickness.

I do appoint my
trusty friend Edward Henderson the executor to this my
last will and testament if my ~~decease~~ ^{decease} takes
place before ~~my~~ ^{my son Ziba} arrives at the age of twenty one
years otherwise I do appoint my son Ziba executor
to this my last will and testament. Witness my
