memory and understanding (for which blessings I
thank God) do make ^{and publish} this my last will and testament
in manner following that is to say:

debts and funeral Expenses be duly paid and
satisfied as soon as conveniently can be after my death.

It is also my will and I do order that the land near
Samptown containing about seventy acres be sold
as soon as may appear practicable after my death
Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Mercy Osmun full power and controul of all
my property both personal and real Estate during
her widdowhood and If she should get married
It is my will and I do bequeath unto her one
third of all my remaining property personal
and real Estate during her natural life

I do further order that the residue of my said
property after the death or marriage of
my said wife I do order and my will is
that It be Equally divided among my
surviving heirs share and share alike

Lastly I hereby appoint my loving wife Mercy
Osmun and Zephth L Remyon my ^{full and} Executors of this my last will and testament
and Guardians to my children during their
minority
