I. Abraham of born of the Township of Howell County
of Monmouth and State of New Jersey being of sound mind
and memory B^e God for it Do Make and publish
this my last Will and testament
first I Recommend my Soul to God that gave it and my
Body to the grave

second I Gave and bequeath to my Dear beloved wife Elizabeth
one bead and heading sufficient to Dress the head and
the one fifth part or share of all the Remainer of my
movable Estate except my Waggon horses and harness
and my Long Gun and also I Gave to my beloved
wife Elizabeth the Choice of all the Rooms in my house
So she take onely one Room and all that I have for
my beloved wife Elizabeth is Given to her in Lieu of
Dower or thirds and the Room is Given to her Dur-
ing her natural Life and know longer

Third I Gave and bequeath to my Son Samuel of born all
the plantation where on he now Lives near the head
of Barnagate bay on Manasquan River and also
one third of all my salt and sedge meadows lying
on Manasquan beach and sedge and the one third part
of all my Sueder Swamps

fourth I Gave and bequeath to my Son Abraham of born
all that plantation where on he now Lives on the North
Side Manasquan River and also a Lot of Wood Land
I Bot of Catharine Wilson Containing between
ten and eleven acres and also the one half part of all
my salt meadows lying at the head of Barnagate
Bay westward of the Schaw Ditch and also the one
half of a Lot of upland and meadows lying at Redypoint
on South Side of Manasquan River and also the one
third part or share of all my salt meadows and
Sedges meadows lying on Manasquan beach and sedge
and also the one third part of all my Sueder Swamps

Fifth I gave and bequeath to my son James of born all my Homestead farm or plantation where on I now live and the half of all my Salt meadows lying at the head of Barnegate bay westward of the Schow Ditch and also the one third part or Share of all my Salt meadows & ledge meadows lying on Manasquan beach and Stagers and also the one third part or share of all my Sluice swamps and also the one half of a lot of meadows and up land lying on the South side of Manasquan River at Steady point and also one farm Waggon and my two farm or worken horses ^{with harness} and also my Long Gun and my Will is that my son James of born do find his mother a Deasont and Comfort abel Living as long as she will please to live with him

Sixth I gave ^{by bequeath} to my Grandchildren the Children and Heirs of my son William of born that is now Deceased viz James of born Aner of born Elizabeth of born Isaac of born Sarah of born Jacob of born John of born Mary of born Abraham of born Zebulon of born I gave and bequeath to my Grandchildren above named to be equally divided between them all Share and Shares like all my Land & meadows lying on the South side of Maticunk River on Maticunk neck to be equally divided between all my above named Grandchildren Share & Shares like

Seventh I gave and bequeath to my Daughter Catharine Curtis and to my Daughter Annas Havens and to my Daughter Jane Havens and to my two Grand Children Zebel M Clayton & Abraham Clayton all the Residue of my Estate to be divided equally into four parts my three Daughters Catharine Curtis Annas Havens and Jane Havens each one to have the one fourth part and the

I Equally a Like and my two Grandchildren
Ezabel M Clayton and Abraham M Clay to have the
other fourth part or share Equally Divided be
tween them Sheave and Sheave & like and my
Debts and funeral Charges to be paid before the
the Last Division in my Estate between my
three Daughter and two Grand Children and my
Will is that my Executors keep and take Care of
Sheav Cuming to my two Grand Children Ezabel
M Clayton and Abraham M Clayton until they
become of age or twenty one years old my Grand
Son and eighteen years old my Grand Daughter
and then pay each ones share to them and in
case ^{one} Die before it come of age if the other one
be Living that one to have the full share that
I have gave to them both and I Appoint my two



