In the Name of God Amen I Samuel Osborn of the County of Massachusetts  
and Eastern Division of the Province of New Jersey being in a reasonable State of Health and of Sound Mind and Memory  
Vincibly do hereby give and assign his manifold Estates to his three Sons my last will and Testament in manner  
here following. First and principally I give my Soul into the hands of God that gave it. And my Body to the Earth to be decently  
buried to my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection to receive the same again by the mighty Power of God  
Arising from the Dead. I Give and Bequeath Directly to all after the following manner and form.

I Give and Bequeath unto my three Sons William the eldest his Share here on Natick his Heirs & Assigns for Ever.  
My second and youngest Son James the youngest his Share here on Natick his Heirs & Assigns for Ever.  
I Give and Bequeath to my third and youngest Son Samuel the youngest his Share here on Natick his Heirs & Assigns for Ever.

I Give all my less lots of Meads and Meadows on Manasquan Beach unto my three Sons William James & Samuel  
their Heirs and Assigns for Ever to be Equally Divided among them.  
I Give all my less lots of Meads and Upland lying to the South Side of the Manasquan River unto my three  
Eldest Sons William and James to be Equally divided between them unto their Heirs & Assigns for Ever.

I Give to my eldest Daughter Alice Langdree my Great Bible  
I Give to my two Sons Peter and Tom in Consideration of their faithfull Service to me their Freedom yet Sub-  
jecting them to And I hereby order that each of them shall yearly pay to my Executors Forty Shillings apiece to be laid up  
for them in case they should not be able to maintain themselves in their Decease.

All the rest of my Personal Estate I Give to my three Sons William James and Samuel Osborn to be Equally  
Divided between them And I hereby constitute and make my said three Sons Executors of this my last will and  
Testament to wit: that the same be faithfully performed.

I Give to my Daughters Alice Mary and the Children of my daughter Catherine deceased late wife of Henry Langdree and  
my youngest Daughter Audria the Sum of Two Hundred pounds that is to say Fifty Pounds apiece to my three living  
Daughters And the other Fifty pound to the Children of my said deceased daughter Catherine. to be lawfully divided among them  
all which Legacies of money shall be paid to said Daughters within two years next after my decease. The Instructions  
in the next paragraph being observed for

My Will is and I order that my Executors shall give the Fifty pound I have given to my youngest daughter Audria



Be it Remembered that on this First day of May in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty four. Tylor Chamberlain and Mary Spornon two of the Subscribing witnesses to the within will Certifiably Appeared before me, Jacob Dennis Duty Authorised to prove wills and Qualify Executors And being solemnly Sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God Did solemnly depose & Declare, that they were present and saw Samuel Osborn, the Testator within named, Sign and Seal the within written instrument, the said him publicly pronounce and Declare, the same to be his last will and Testament And that at the time of the doing thereof, the said was of sound mind and Memory, to the best of their Depositions Judgments, And also in health of Body, And that they the said Depositions together with Anthony Woodward Junr and Jacob Dennis, the other two Subscribing witnesses solemnly signed their Names thereto as witnesses thereof, in the Presence of the said Testator and of each other.

Be it Also Remembered that at the same time, William Osborn, James Osborn, and Samuel Osborn, the Executors in the within will named were duly Qualified and Sworn to the true Execution of the same before me.
