did Depose that they were present and saw James Osborn the Testator within named Sign and Seal the within written
instrument and heard him publicly pronounce and Declare the same to be his last will and Testament. And that at
the time of the doing thereof he was of sound mind and Understanding to the best of their Judgments and as they believed
And that the said Deponents together with Remembrance Lippincott the other Subscribing Witness to the within will
severally Signed their Names thereto as Witnesses thereof in the presence of the said Testator & of each other
Also at the same time Samuel Osborn the Surviving Executor in the within named (the other being since dead) was
duly Sworn to the true Execution thereof before us.
