In the Name of God amons the 8th day of August in the year of our Lord 1762 I Anne Osborn of Saverbury in the County of Monmouth being weak of Body but of perfect Mind and memory thanks be given unto God have here Calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Flesh once to dye I do make and ordain this my Last will and testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my ~~Body~~ Soul into the hands of God that give it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the destruction of my Executor nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to Bless me in this Life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Rebacca Swane the several iser and one Silver Plate I give to my daughter Cathin Dmy Silver Tankards and my bed and furniture ^{and the warming} ^{and 2 silver spoons} ~~for it~~ and two Silver Plates and my Looking Glass and the Towels and all my waring Cloths ^{and} all the Rest of my Estate to be Sold at Publick Vendue after my funeral Charges and all my Just debts is paid the

Remainder if any Be to be applied to pay for my daughter Cathin to have schooling and I do hereby constitute and ordain Samuel Long Street Executor of this my Last will and Testament and I do hereby Revoke and Disannul all my former testaments wills Legacies and Executors by me in any ways before this time made and Bequeath Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last will and testament in witness where of I have here unto set my hand and seal the day and year above written
