In the name of God Amen - I Elishalet Osborn  
of the township of Hanover in the county of Morris  
and State of New Jersey being of sound mind mem-  
ory and understanding make and declare this my  
last Will and Testament in manner following viz

Item first - It is my will that all my debts and  
funeral expences be paid from the proceeds of my person-  
al estate -

Item Second That all my real estate be sold to satisfy  
a certain Mortgage given by me to Joseph B. Pierson  
my Executors hereinafter named being hereby authorized  
and directed to sell the same and to give good and  
sufficient Secd for it.

Item third - It is my will that whatever may remain  
of my estate either real or personal after satisfying  
my debts shall be equally divided between my nieces  
Mary Hatterway and Margaret S. Ward -

Item fourth. It is my will and I hereby appoint James  
Sucker and Edward Howell to be Executors of this will and  
empower them to act in all things as above directed -


