I. Israel D Osborn of Chatham New Jersey  
do make and declare this to be my last Will & Testament  
and dispose of my property as follows

First I give and bequeath to my wife Charlotte  
one thousand dollars also all the household goods  
also all the live stock then may be at my decease to  
have and hold the same absolutely at her disposal  
— and in lieu of dower

Second I give to my wife Charlotte the Interest  
of fifteen hundred dollars yearly during her natural  
life to be paid by my Executor when collected from bonds  
secured by real estate

Third I give to my wife that part of the homestead  
buildings & land as by deed purchased of David Sanders  
& where we now reside, the use and benefit during  
her natural life and after her death my  
Grand Nephew Israel D Osborn son of Elias to take  
possession of the same as his own if of age if not a  
guardian for him for his use and benefit till of  
age & then the said Israel D Osborn to have and  
hold the same & at his disposal

Fourth I direct that the fifteen hundred dollars left on  
Interest for the benefit of my wife to be as soon as  
can be collected after her death equally divided  
between my Nephews Wm G Osborn now in California  
Israel D Osborn Junr of Ohio and Asahel Osborn  
of Otsego County New York

Fifth I direct that the house & land known as the Stephen  
— C Bonnell property & purchased of Wm G Osborn be sold  
as soon as convenient without too much loss & the proceeds  
used as herein directed

Sixth I give to my Nephew Elias Osborn Three hundred dollars  
also ten acres of land lying in the great swamp adjoining  
his own land David Morehouse & others

Seventh I give to my Nephew Smith S Holloway  
one thousand dollars

Eighth I give to my Niece Marilla Osborn of Otsego Co  
New York two hundred dollars

Ninth I give to my Nephew Joseph W Osborn of  
Ohio fifty dollars and the old family bible and  
records of my Fathers family

Finally I direct that after paying all debts & putting  
up new grave stones for my father & mother and  
one for myself, the three not to exceed fifty  
dollars that the residue of my estate be equally  
divided between my wife & Smith S Holloway  
and I hereby nominate & appoint Smith S Holloway  
Sole executor of this my last will & Testament
