Know all men by these presents
that I Leah Osburn, wife of Silas
Osburn in the City of Paterson and State
of New Jersey being in ill health but of
sound mind and memory do make
and publish this my last will and testament
herby revoking all former wills by me at any
time heretofore made.

My will is that all my just debts and
funeral expences shall, shall by my executors
hereinafter named be paid out of
my estate and that a stone be put up
to mark where I lay as soon after my
decease as shall be found convenient
of give devise and bequeath to my dear
husband Silas Osburn for his use and support
while he lives the house and three lots which
are now situated in Brown street near the
Roman Catholic burying ground. And also
as much money from time to time as
my Executor may think he needs out
Leah Osburn

of whatever money may be in my
executors hand. and after all the
money is exhausted. let my executor
may sell the lots on Brown Street or
any part of them. to support my
dear husband Silas Osburn while
he lives

I give to my dear sister Catherine
two my wearing apparel and a double
blanket

I leave four pair of Pillow Cases to
Jane Arny and also the equal Division
of all the furniture and bedding at
the death of my husband Silas
Osburn. the other half to go to my
dear sister Catherine Newton

If at my dear husband's death
the house and lots be not sold I
leave the one lot with the stable and
tree next to Jane Arny and the
other two with the house on them
to my nephew John Acker the
lots are 25 x 100 feet and if the lots
Leah Osburn

and house have been sold I leave
whatever money after my husband's
general expenses are paid to
be divided between Jane Arny and
John Acker one third to Jane Arny
two thirds to John Acker

I do nominate and appoint
John St. Robinson clerk to be the exe-
cutor of this my last will and
testament. I authorize him to take
up the money that is owing to
his estate by Fredrick ~~son~~
of Rockland County N. York state
and also the money on deposit in
the ~~Catharine~~ Savings Bank of this
City - and give to my dear husband
Silas Osburn so much from time to
time as he may see fit. St. Robinson may
think proper while the money lasts.
