Charges be paid by my Executors herein after named also that all my Debts
that can conveniently be collected I give and bequeath to my wife
the one third part of my Estate and to my brother the Other two thirds of
my Estate and that my brother Thomas Offborn Do take care of my father
what he lives Now the full Intent and meaning of this is that I am
about to take a Long and about Journey If I should Die before I return
that then this my Last will and Testament Do take place

I Also give my brother Thomas Offborn my gun and chest of tools Exclusive
of the Other part of My Estate together with my wearing Apparels and further
I Do constitute Thomas Offborn for My Brother and John Parry to be
Executors to this my Last will and Testament If my wife according to
Custom and time from my Departure should have Issue and it should
Live to the age of Majority the said Thomas Offborn shall pay the said
Issue fifty pounds In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this Day of May One thousand seven Hundred
and Ninety Seven
