In the name of God Amen, I John  
Osborn of the township of Hardyston, Coun-  
ty of Sussex and State of New Jersey, yeoman,  
being of a sound mind and perfect recol-  
-lection, but knowing that my nature is  
mortal, do ordain and appoint this to  
be my last will and testament -

I commit my soul into the hands of Him  
who gave it, and request my body to be bur-  
-ied with decent christian burial -

After my funeral charges and all other  
just debts are discharged and satisfied;  
I bequeath the remainder of my proper-  
-ty real and personal to my surviving  
family to be divided and distributed  
amongst them agreeably to the exist-  
-ing law of this State -

I do appoint my trusty brother Basse  
Osborn to be the Executor of this my  
last will and testament -

In addition to the above I do bequeath  
the feathers belonging to a bed now in my  
possession to my eldest daughter Sarah Hin-  
-dred - The chest of drawers which my wife  
brought here, I do bequeath to be returned to  
her - Done this 9th day of ~~June~~ 23<sup>rd</sup> 1793
