2nd I give and Bequeath My Wearing Apparel to my two Sisters
Lydia Bonbr and Charity Ann Pierson to be as near
Equally Divided by My Said Executor for their Share
and Share a Like
3rd I give and Bequeath My Homestead Lands with all
The improvements thereon Where I now Live Containing
About three or four Acres Be the Same more or less as
Conveyed to me by Deed of Abram Vanturnute and Mary his
Wife and Isaac Osborn dated April 12th 1808 Together with
all My House Hold Goods to My Brother Isaac Osborn
To have and Dispose of as he Pleas Subject to the following
4th Charge of Fifty Dollars \$50.00 Now I give and Bequeath the
Sum of Fifty Dollars to the Presbyterian Church in Sparta to be
Paid in five Equal Payments of Ten Dollars Per Year for five
Years from my Decease And I do hereby Charge the Same
As a Debt on My Said Estate untill Paid And the Receipts
from year to year from the Proper Officer of said Church shall
Be a Sufficient voucher for the Payment of the Same
5th The Residue of My Personal Property and all Notes on Money Due
Me And a Wood Lot of five Acres more or less Adjoining Lands of
David Youngs and Others As Conveyed to me by Deed dated April 12th
1808 of Abram Vanturnute & Mary his Wife & Isaac Osborn I Order My
Said Executor to sell at Public or Private Sale And Make Good
and Sufficient Title for the Same to the Purchaser
And after Paying My Just Debt Cobs and Expences Whatsoever

There May Be Left I Order to be Estimated or divided into
Six Equal Parts Shore and Shore a like

The one Sixth Part I give and Bequeath to My Sister Lydia Barker

The one Sixth Part I give & Bequeath to My Brother Jonathan Croston

The one Sixth Part I give & Bequeath to My Brother Silas Croston

The one Sixth Part I give & Bequeath to My Brother Henry Croston

The one Sixth Part I give & Bequeath to My Sister Charity Ann Pierson

And Whereas My Sister Mary Westermute is Dead Now

I do Order and it is my Will the one Sixth Part Be Equally

Divided with her five Daughters Namely Elizabeth Welch

Sarah Johnson Northiam Cisco Burthana Pierson &

Maryann Westermute Shore and Shore a like

Lastly I do hereby Appoint My True and Faith

ful Brother Isaac Croston Executor of this My Last

Will and testament In Witness Whereof I have here

unto set my Hand and Seal Published and Declared

This fourth Day of March 1872 at North Croston


