TO THE SURROGATE OF THE COUNTY OF CAYUGA:

The Petition of *Orrin Netchkief* of the town
of *Waterbury* in the County of *New York* respectfully sheweth:

That your petitioner is one of the Administrators of
Oliver Osborn late of the town of *Waterbury* of and
the said *Osborn* now deceased; that the said deceased died on or about the
Second day of *July* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and ~~thirty~~ *forty one*; that at, or immediately preceding the time of his death,
he was an inhabitant of said County of *New York* that he has left no Will, as far as
your petitioner has been able to discover: That the said deceased left *no*
widow, that he left the following kindred, to wit: *Charles*

Osborn of *Waterbury* of and *Charles Perkins* of
the town of *Bethany* & County of *Madison*. That your petitioner
and *Chas. F. Loomis* of *Waterbury* of and were duly appointed
administrators of the goods Chattel & Credits of the said deceased by the
order of the Court of *Admiralty* of the District of *Waterbury* of and by letters
bearing date the *twelfth* day of *July* 1841. That the said deceased left
assets in the County of *Cayuga* State of *New York*

That in the opinion of your petitioner the whole amount of the personal property left by
the said deceased, ^{in the County of Cayuga} will not exceed in value the sum of *Three thousand & 50*
hundred & fifty Dollars.

Your petitioner therefore prays that letters of Administration upon the estate of the
said deceased may be granted to him.

deceased, made the *Sixth* day of *Sept.* 1841
by *Orin Hotchkiss* Administrator,
with the aid of *Medina Tappin & John Tappin*
appraisers duly appointed and sworn according to law.

The following articles are set off to the widow of

A certain Bond & Mortgage Executed by said *Wigam Allen* in
the County of Cayuga State of New York, to *William Orsburn*
of the Town of *Watertown* in the County of *Nuchavon* State
of *Connecticut* 16th day of *March* 1836 & now due, and to
become due, on said *Mortgage* three thousand three hundred
Dollars, and the annual ^{interest} on the whole amount, from the
16th *March* 1841 - The Mortgage above stated covers the
following piece of land, to wit: "All that certain lot piece
or parcel of land situate being and being in the County
of *Cayuga* known and distinguished by being a part of
lot number twenty in the Township of *Bradus* New York in
the Military tract and bounded as follows and viz:
from thence north on the west line thereof thirty One
Chains & sixty two links thence east and parallel with
the South line of the lot thirty One Chains and sixty two
links thence south and parallel to the west line of the lot
thirty One chains & sixty two links to the south line of
the lot thence west on the south side of the lot thirty
One Chains & sixty two links to the place of beginning
Containing One hundred Acres of land, at two Mails
from the *main* *road* at the point *East* *valley*
