The petition of Ebenezer Whelan of Ira in said County,
as rightfully sheweth, that your petitioner & Judah Osborn
have been duly appointed Administrators of the estate
of William Osborn late of Ira aforesaid deceased, that
Judah Osborn the other Administrator has since deceased,
that he has made & filed an inventory of the personal
property of said deceased, & applied the same ~~value~~
as he conveniently could to the payment of his debts that
he has discovered that the same will be insufficient to
pay the debts of the deceased, & the expenses of Administration.

That the debts of the deceased as far as he can ascertain
will amount to about nine hundred dollars, over &
above the personal property of said deceased, That
said debts are not secured by mortgage or judgment
or expressly charged upon the real estate of said decd.

That the said deceased died seized of the following
real estate to wit: ^{All that} certain piece or parcel of land
situate & lying in the town of Ira in the County of
Cayuga, bounded as follows on the north ^{by lands} bounded by Luther
Hannam on the west by lands owned by Abel Burr on
the south by lands owned by Ebenezer Whelan, on the east
