

To the Surrogate of the County of Erie: *Laura Osborne and Maurice Osborne, Administratrix and Administrator* of the goods &c of *Maurice Osborne* do render the following account of *their* proceedings as *Administrators* of the *goods &c* of *Maurice Osborne* deceased: On the *21st* day of *October* A. D. 1868, Letters of Administration were issued to *them*. On the *fourteenth* day of *November* A. D. 1868, we caused an Inventory of the personal estate of the deceased to be filed in this Office, which personal estate therein set forth, amounts by appraisement by the appraisers, duly appointed, to \$ *9672.88*.

Schedule A hereto annexed, contains a statement of all the property contained in said Inventory, sold at public or private sale, with the prices and manner of sale; which sales were fairly made, at the best prices that could then be had, also a statement of all the debts due the said estate, and mentioned in said Inventory, which have been collected; and also of all interest for moneys received, for which *they are* legally accountable.

Schedule B hereto annexed, contains a statement of all debts in said Inventory mentioned, not collected or collectable, together with the reasons why the same have not been collected and are not collectable; and of the articles of personal property mentioned in said Inventory, unsold, and the reasons of the same being unsold, and their appraised value; and also a statement of all property mentioned therein, lost by accident, without any willful default or negligence, the cause of its loss, and appraised value. No other assets than those in said inventory, or herein set forth, have come to *their* possession or knowledge, and all the Increase or decrease, in the value of any assets of said deceased, is allowed or charged in said Schedules A and B.
