Know all men by these presents That we Orris Parish, James Cooley, and Samuel Gibbs of the county of Champaign in the State of Ohio, are held and firmly bound unto the Treasurer of the said County of Champaign, in the first and full sum of Two hundred dollars, lawful money of the United States to be paid to the said Treasurer, for which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves and each of us by himself, for and in the whole sum, our and every of our heirs, executors and administrators firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated the Twentieth fifth day of December, one Thousand Eight hundred and nineteen, The condition of the above obligation is such; Whereas by the court of common Pleas of the county aforesaid, administration of all and singular the goods and chattles rights and credits, which were of Beverly Spencer, late of the county aforesaid, deceased at the time of his death, hath been committed unto the above named Orris Parish, Now therefore, if the said Orris Parish, shall from time to time and at all times well and faithfully perform all and singular the duties enjoined on him as administrator of the estate of the said Beverly Spencer, deceased, according to law, then the above obligation to be void and of now effect, Otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue in law.
