Be it Remembered that at a Special court of common Pleas held at the court house in Urbana in and for the county of Champaign and State of Ohio before the Honorable Samuel Stett, James Smith and Abner A. Colwell Esquires a special Judge of said court, on the 20th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, the last will and Testament of Levi Osborne deceased was produced in open court, by William Hester the Executor therein named and proven by the Oaths of John Wiley and James Ashing the two subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. Which will, in words and figures, reads as follows to wit

In the name of God: Amen. I Levi Osborne of Champaign County being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and Memory, do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, That is to say. First, after all my general expenses are paid, I give and bequeath unto Joseph Osborn the South half of the North West quarter of Section one of Township five in Range eleven between the Meane Rivers, and the equal half of thirty Acres of Wood Land: provided Joseph Osborn in three months after my death secures the payment of three hundred and fifty dollars to Jeremiah Osborn to be paid within two years from my decease. My will is that the balance of my property both real and personal be sold and two hundred dollars of the money paid to the heirs of James Osborn now living with their mother, and the balance of the money divided equally between the heirs of Alexander Johnston and Jesse Johnston, David Osborn and Samuel Hucades. And hereby appoint William Hester my sole Executor of my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourteenth day of November in the year of our Lord 1822
