This Indenture made thirteenth day of May A. D. Eighteen hundred and thirty nine between David Osburn and Presocia Osburn his wife of Green County and State of Ohio of the one part and Thomas Morris of Clermont County and State of Ohio of the other part Witnesseth that the said David Osburn and Presocia Osburn of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of thirty dollars good and lawful money to them in hand paid by the said Thomas Morris the receipt there of they do hereby acknowledge have sold and by these presents doth sell convey and forever confirm unto the said Thomas Morris his heirs and assigns A lott of ground in the addition to Millford No 22 Best of the little Miami in Clermont County and State of Ohio bounded on the South by Main Street on the West by front Alley on the North by lot No 27 and on the East by lot No 21, sixty feet in front and ninety feet back to have and to hold Lot No 22 with all its appertences free from claimers unto the said Thomas Morris his heirs and assigns forever and the said David Osburn and Presocia Osburn his wife who doth hereby relinquish her right of dower doth bind themselves their heirs and executors or administrators by these presents forever to Warrent and Defend the lott of ground No 22 free from themselves and all other persons whatsoever unto the said Thomas Morris his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof the said David Osburn and Presocia Osburn his wife have herunto set their hands and seals the day and date above written

James Madison, President of the United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 Know Ye, That in consideration of military service performed
 by James Jackson, (a Sergeant for the war) to the United States,
 in the Virginia Line on continental Establishment, and in
 pursuance of an act of the Congress of the United States,
 passed on the 10th day of August in the year 1790, intituled
 "An act to enable the officers and soldiers of the Virginia line
 on continental Establishment, to obtain titles to certain
 lands lying north west of the river Ohio, between the Little
 Miami and Sciota" and another act of the said Congress
 passed on the 9th day of June in the year 1794, amendatory
 of the said act, There is granted by the United States, unto
 Samuel Finley, assignee of Limecon Buford, who was assignee
 of the said James Jackson, a certain tract of land containing
 Four Hundred acres situate between the Little Miami and
 Sciota Rivers, north west of the river Ohio, as by survey bearing
 date the twenty sixth day of May in the year one thousand
 seven hundred and eighty eight, and bounded and described
 as follows, to wit: survey of four hundred acres of land on a milita-
 ry warrant N^o 3498, in favor of the said James Jackson, on the
 N. W. of the Ohio, and on the waters thereof, Beginning at a poplar
 and a dogwood, corner to Nathaniel Lucas' survey N^o 1753, and
 N. W. corner to Col. Davies' survey N^o 506, running with his line
 S 400 poles to a sugar tree, ash, and beech, south west corner to Davies
 thence S 85 W 137 poles to a locust, ash, and beech, lower back corner
 to John Dandridge's survey N^o 437, thence with his line S 73 W 45
 poles to an ash and two buckeyes in Dandridges line and corner
 to Robert Jauith's survey N^o 1517, thence with Jauith's line N 13 W 112
 poles to a hickory, ash, and hoopwood, corner to Jauith and in the line
 of William Fowler's survey N^o 261, thence with Fowler's line N 70 E 70
 poles to two ash and a beech upper back corner, to Fowler, thence with
