 will named it is ordered that letters
 testamentary be granted to the said Charles
 A. Moore and Lindsey C. Moore who thereupon
 gave bond with security to the acceptance
 of the Court in the penal sum of Fifteen
 hundred dollars conditioned according
 to law whereupon it is ordered that John
 White Henry Bonnell and Joseph Post appraise
 the personal property of said estate.

The last will and Testament of Silman
 Osbourn late of this County deceased was
 this day brought before the Court and
 was proved by the oaths of Benjamin Riggs
 and John Corney the witnesses thereto whose
 examinations were reduced to writing and
 it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court
 that the said Silman Osbourn at the time

of executing said will was of full age and of sound mind and memory and not under any restraint it is ordered that said will and the proof so reduced to writing be recorded.

Will to Wit

I Silmon Osburn of the County of Clermont in the State of Ohio do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

First it is my will that my funeral expences and all my just debts be fully paid

Second I give devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Ann Osburn twenty dollars per year as long as she ~~shall~~ remains my widow in lieu of her dower and when she ceases to remain my widow the above payments to cease.

I also give and bequeath to my loving wife all my household and kitchen furniture

Third I give devise and bequeath to my brother Preston Osburn all my right title interest and claim to the farm formerly belonging to Benjamin Osburn my father on the following conditions that is the said Preston shall pay all my honest debts and likewise to pay to Elizabeth Ann widow the above twenty dollars as stated above and also

I give and devise to my brother Preston all my farming utensils horses cattle sheep hogs including all the out property on the farm

And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint brother Preston Osburn to be the executor for this my last will and Testament revoking and annulling all former wills by me made and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In Testimony

Whereof I have subscribed at my hand and seal this 20th day of October A.D. 1863
