State of Ohio -

do. make this my last will and Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills. and codicils
to wills. by me made -

first - I direct that all my debts be paid
out of my Personal Property -

second - I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Lucy one half of my Personal
Property - also. the Use. Rents. and
Profits of all my real Estate - with the
appurtenances therunto belonging. during
her lifetime -

third - I give and bequeath to my daughter
Broa - one half of my Personal Property

fourth - After the decease of my Wife Lucy -
I direct & desire. that my real Estate
be divided Equally among my Children
to wit - Asenith Kemer - George M. Osborn
William Osborn, Broa Osborn, Levia Osborn,
Sally Bruce, James Osborn, Asa G. Osborn,
Joshua Osborn, Charles C. Osborn, & Lucy Ann
Bruce - I hereby appoint my Wife Lucy
& Horne Williams. my Executors -
Signed & Sealed. this sixth day of July
1843 in. Presence of -
