WHEREAS at a court holden by us on the *seventh* day of *May* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *fourteen* at the court house in Chillicothe, in the county aforesaid

Richard Osburn of said County

as is alleged lately died intestate, having whilst living, and at the time of his death, goods and chattels, within this state and county, by means whereof, ordering and granting administration of all and singular, the said goods and chattels, and also the auditing, allowing, and final discharging the account thereof doth appertain to us; and we being desirous that the goods and chattels of the deceased, may be well and truly administered, applied and disposed of, do grant unto the said

freeholders, under oath or affirmation; and also a true and accurate statement of the debts due and owing said estate, so far as they come to your hands, possession and knowledge; and be same so made to return or cause to be returned to the Clerk's Office, of our said court, within three months, and also shall adjust and settle up the accounts of said estate, and deposit such account in our Clerk's Office, within twelve months, unless further time be allowed: And we do, by these presents, depute, constitute and appoint you the said *Isaac Claypool*
