Joshua Osborn Sec^y Will

I Joshua Osborn of Southington in the County of Drumbull in the State of Ohio do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say First it is my will that all my funeral expenses and all my just debts be fully paid. Secnd I give and devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Diana Osborn all the household furniture and goods I possess and three cows such as she may select and my horse and wagon ^{harness} and saddle and bridles the bees and honey hogs and sheep and so much of the hay as ^{she} will keep the above named stock the ensuing winter and spring all the oats also all the crops now growing upon the premises also to have and to hold Two Hundred Dollars over and above her right of dower if needed for her use or support all the rest of my property both ^{real} ~~real~~ and ^{personal} ~~personal~~ and yet I give to my heirs to be equally divided except Sheldon Osborn is to have Twenty Dollars more than the rest. John Stewart Sec^y Will,

In the name of God Amen.

I John Stewart of Liberty in the County of Drumbull and State of Ohio considering the uncertainty of life and in order to dispose of such estate as Providence has permitted me to have do make and publish this my last Will and Testament and in manner following viz First I will and direct my executors hereinafter named from my personal property to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses and provide suitable grave stones for my place of rest. Secnd I will and direct my Executors ^{to pay} the sum of one hundred dollars at interest secured in a proper manner and the interest accruing and arising therefrom to be paid to the Rev^d David Goodwillie yearly for such period of time and for so long as the said Goodwillie shall continue to be a preacher of the Gospel according to the doctrines of the Associate Presbyterian Church in the township of Liberty and no longer and ^{the} ~~the~~ interest is to go for stipends and applied to the Liberty Congregational order Third After the benefit of the last before mentioned bequest to the said David Goodwillie shall cease and expire according to the terms of the bequest then I direct my Executors to pay the said One hundred dollars to the Trustees for the time being of the Associate Presbyterian Church in Liberty a^s a^{id} for the use and benefit of the congregation and to be applied in such manner as the congregation shall direct Fourth I will and direct my executors to pay from my estate to John Stewart Bard son of W^m Bard Esq the sum of one hundred dollars which I hereby bequeath to him Fifth I will and direct that James Geddes of Liberty hold such sum or sums of money which he may owe me at my decease for the period of one year from that time without interest and direct my executors to allow him the same on settlement ^{with} of said Geddes and that said Geddes have a reasonable time to pay the principal sum or sums after that period, shall arrive and elapsed. Sixth all the rest and residue of my Estate of every name and nature I will devise and bequeath as follows to wit To Robert Stewart Samuel Stewart Dana Stewart Ann Russell wife of
