William Russell of Lima each one eighteenth part: To the children of Rosanna McCalland viz. William McCalland, Rosanna McCalland, George McCalland and Polly McCalland together one eighteenth part. To the children of William Stewart viz. Polly Stewart Armstrong, Stewart, John Jane Stewart, Rebecca Rachel Ann Stewart and Samuel Stewart together one eighteenth part all of whom are descendants of my half brother Alexander Stewart. To Margaret daughter of Samuel Stewart my brother or if deceased before my death or now deceased then to her heirs one eighteenth part. To the heirs of Margaret Cowdry one eighteenth part. To James Stewart, James William Stewart and Charlotte Stewart each one eighteenth part. All of whom commencing with the said Margaret are of the descendants of my brother Samuel Stewart. To Samuel Stewart, Mary Dentley, Jane Stewart, Eliza Stewart children of my brother David Stewart each one eighteenth part. And it is further my will and desire that if any one of the children of my brother David should fail to call on my executor for the portion so willed & bequeathed to them <sup>with</sup> in ten years from my decease then that such portion or portions which shall not be called for shall be equally divided among the children of said David or such of them as shall have called for their portion or portions within that time. To Robert Stewart 2<sup>d</sup> and Ebenezer S. Stewart sons of my half brother William Stewart each one eighteenth part. It is further my will and desire that if anyone of the legatees herein named should die previous to my decease then that the portions herein bequeathed to such one should go to and be received by his or her heirs in like manner as if the same were herein directly willed and bequeathed to such heirs. Seventh, I will and bequeath to Alexander Stewart son of my half brother Alexander Stewart my new coat and which is not intended to be included in any of the foregoing bequests. Eighth I will and direct my executor to give and divide among my relatives and in such manner as they may think best, my bed and bed clothes which are not intended to be included in <sup>any of</sup> the foregoing bequests. And lastly I hereby authorize constitute and appoint Robert Stewart 1<sup>st</sup> and Samuel Dentley the Executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby revoke all other and former wills <sup>not made and declare this as no other by</sup> by my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this twenty seventh day of June Anno Domini One thousand eight hundred and thirty seven. John Stewart 2<sup>d</sup> Signed Sealed Published and declared by the above named John Stewart as his last Will and Testament in presence of the subscribers who have signed their names hereto and attested the same in presence of the Testator and of each other this twenty seventh day of June. A.D. 1837.
