Will of Margaret Colburn. WHEREAS it is appointed unto men once
 to die, and being assured that the solemn hour
 is fast approximating. — O Margaret Colburn, of
 the County of Adams, in the State of Pennsylvania, being desirous of arrang-
 ing my temporal affairs before I go hence, do hereby ordain and determine
 when the following Settlements of my property. — On committing my soul to
 that God who gave it, I do appoint William Canard and Levi
 Colburn residing in the County and State aforesaid, to be the executors
 of this my Will, and I do authorize them to pay all my debts and fun-
 eral expences, in relation to my worldly estate, wherewith it hath
 pleased God to bless me in this life. I give and dispose of it in the
 following manner, to wit, It is my will that all the property I do
 possess of, wearing apparel, furniture, money &c. be equally divided
 amongst my four daughters (viz) Margaret, Anna, Mary & Magdalena,
 the cloths excepted which I give to my son Levi Colburn, provided
 the above named Anna & Mary, receive from their Father's property
 one hundred dollars more than the legacy of five hundred as mentioned
 in his Will. But if they should not receive one hundred a piece as above

Stated, - It is my Will that my executors pay my two Daughters, viz Anna and Mary, one hundred Dollars each and then the balance be equally divided amongst my four Daughters, as aforesaid. Lastly I empower my Executors to revoke and disannul all former and other Wills, by me heretofore made, and to ratify and confirm this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament, and that my estate be settled up in twelve months after my decease. An Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of May one thousand eight hundred & thirty five.
