The last Will and Testament of the Rev.  
Joseph Osborn of Patton Township Allegheny County  
Pa. Made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 1851 is as follows viz  
Part 1<sup>st</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son John my  
Gold Watch and Library. Except such Books that  
has Jane her Mothers Name in them I do will  
and bequeath them to Frances my daughter

Part 2<sup>d</sup> It is my desire that all my Property  
Real and Personal be sold by my Executors as  
they may find it most convenient to do so


Part 3<sup>d</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Beloved wife  
Mary one thousand dollars to be paid by my  
Executors as soon as it can be conveniently Made  
out the Property

Part 4<sup>th</sup> It is my desire after my Doctors bill and  
funeral Expenses is paid that the Proceeds of my  
Property be Invested for the use of my Children  
John and Frances Equally Between them after the  
thousand Dollars is paid to my Wife

And I do constitute and appoint Thomas Mc Masters  
of Patton Township and Hugh D King of the City of  
Pittsburgh to be my Executors of this my last will and  
Testament. In Witness whereof I the said Joseph  
Osborn have hereunto set my hand <sup>and</sup> seal the day  
and year above mentioned
