Matthew McConnell's Company of Invelacks being in a sick and Low condition but in perfect strength of mind I do comit my soul to God who gave it & after my Body is to be buried in a Christianable manner and all Charges paid I do Declare this to be my last will and testament and I do give and bequeath to my Dearly beloved Wife Sarah Bostil all my pay and Arrears of pay and Apparel and Sufficience of Cloathing and my land money & things due to me at the time of my Discharge from the Regiment of Invelacks and Company as aforesaid. I do hereby constitute and appoint the s^d Sarah Bostil to be my sole and only Heir and Executor of this my Last will and Testament. Thereby Rvoke all former Wills and Testaments by me made or hercafter to be made and I do Solemnly Declare in the presence of God and These Witnesses present this to be my Last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 17th day of May 1784 Philip Bostil signed sealed and Delivered in the as my Last will and Testament of him the said Philip Bostil in the presence of these Will^{ms} Peart Elizabeth Reeves Jas Nicholas East Caln 12th June 1784. Then Personally appeared William Peart and James Nicholas on their Oaths on the holy Evangel of Almighty God and Declare Depose and say that they were present and did see and hear Philip Bostil the Testator Above named sign seal Publish pronounce and Declare the with in Writing as and for his Last will and Testament and that at the doing thereof he was of sound and well disposing mind and memory to the best of their understandings

Best Remembered that on the 12th day of June 1784 The Last will and Testament of Phillip Bostil dec^d was proven in due form of Law and Letters Testamentary were granted to Sarah Bostil sole Ex^{tr} therein named she having been solemnly sworn well and truly to Administer and Bring in an Inventory of the dec^d Estate into the Registers Office for Chester County on or before the 12th day of July next & to render a True and just account of her administration in a year or when thereto Legally Required given under the seal of s^d Office

Phebe Shorne's Will } Phebe Shorne of the Township of Westown in the County of Chester in Pennsylvania being weak of Body but of sound and well disposing mind memory and Remembring uncertainly of this Mortal life have a Desire to settle and Dispose of my Temporal Estate which God in his kind providence hath been pleased to bless me with therefore do in the following manner Settle and Dispose thereof I give Isaac Heald son of my Brother John Heald my largest lot of Land in Newport in Newcastle County upon Delaware to him heirs an assigns forever I give allen Hey son of my sister Elizabeth Hey my other Lot of land in Newport to him his heirs and assigns forever I give my Brother John Heald all the rest and Rendue of my Estate not here before Willed I Dominate & appoint

appoint my ~~Deputy~~ John Heald sole Executor of this my Last will
 and Testament whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this ninth
 day of the month of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven
 Hundred & eighty three. Phebe Osborne the above and within
 Writing was signed sealed Published pronounced & Declared by the said
 Phebe Osborne to be her last Will in the presence of us the subscribers who
 was desired by her to subscribe our names as Witnesses thereto Peter
 Osborne Joshua Hunt East Caln 19th June 1784 Then
 Personally appeared Peter Osborne Joshua Hunt and on their
 solemn affirmations according to Law did declare affirm and say
 that they were present & did see hear Phebe Osborne the Testatrix
 within named sign Seal Publish pronounce & Declare the foregoing
 Writing as & for her Last will and Testament and that at the
 doing thereof she was of a sound & well disposing mind & memory
 to the best of their understandings Affirm before J. Beaton Esq
 Be it Remembered that on the nineteenth day of June A.D.
 1784 The last will and Testament of Phebe Osborne Deceased was
 proven in due form of law and Letters Testamentary were granted
 to John Heald sole Executor therein named he having been solemnly
 Affirmed well and Truly to administer and bring in an Inventory
 of the deceaseds Estate into the Registers office for Chester County on the
 before the 19th day of July next and to render a True and Just account
 of his administration in a year or when thereto Legally required given

 I John Wallace of Oxford Township Chester County in the State
 of Pennsylvania being in firm in body but of Perfect mind and memory
 Thanks unto Almighty God for the same and calling to mind that
 it is appointed for all men Once to die I do make constitute and
 ordain this and this only to be my last will and Testament and as
 Touching my worldly Estate which God in his providence
 hath been pleased to bless me with in this Life I do hereby give
 Devise and Bequeath in the following way & manner
 And First I give my Body to the Dust to be Buried in Decent &
 Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executors & friends And
 all my Just and Lawfull debts to be paid by my Executors hereafter
 named I Give and Bequeath unto my beloved Wife one Gray
 mare one Cow and Three sheep her to use the mare Cows and Sheep to
 be well kept on the Plantation Winter & Summer without cost to her
 During her Natural Life also one Feather Bed & Bedding her to use
 and all the Packer belonging to the House also the one half of all my
 household & kitchen Furniture and Forty Pounds in Money all
 to her & her heirs as one of the Back rooms with a fire place
 and Chimney to be made therein with a Sufficient quantity of firewood
 brought to the Door and cut fit for the fire During her Natural
 Life and also a small garden and six Bushels of Wheate & six
 Bushels of Indian Corn and two Hundred weight of Beef yearly &
 ever
