

Will of Peter Osborne

In the name of God Amen

I Peter Osborn of the Township of West-town in the County of Chester and State of Pennsylvania being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory for I return thanks to almighty God the great disposer of all human events who calls men from this world at such times as it pleaseth him and it is uncertain when I shall be called upon to lay down this mortal life I do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following 1st My Will is and I do order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expences shall be paid as soon as may be after my decease by my Executor herein after named 2^d I give and devise to my Beloved Wife Elizabeth the House we now live in and the cellar under it with the Potted Garden before the door the use of the Smoke House and Springhouse and the privilege of the Water and to go to and from the same to be enjoyed by her during her natural life and from and immediately after her decease I give and devise the same to my son Joseph his heirs and assigns forever I also give and bequeath to my said Wife as much of my Household and Kitchen Furniture as she pleases to take in two months after my decease And I also give to my said Wife as much of all sorts of Fruit yearly and every Year during her life as shall be sufficient for her use of such as shall be growing on the place and a sufficient quantity of Firewood cut and delivered at her Door I further give to my said One Horse, One Cow Two Swine and two Sheep all of her own Choice which Horse Cow Swine & Sheep shall be well kept for her Winter and Summer I do further and bequeath to my said Wife the sum of One hundred dollars to be paid to her out of my Estate yearly and every Year during her natural life And also the further sum of Fifty Dollars to be paid to her in one Month after my decease all which devises and bequests are given to my said Wife in lieu of her Dower 3rd I give and devise to my Son Samuel Osborn his heirs and assigns forever all that my Plantation and tract of Land situate lying and being in Township of Pennsbury in the County of Chester aforesaid which I purchased of John Bowers he my said Son paying out of the same the Dower on said place claimed by Ann the Wife of William Trimble during her natural life and also paying out of the same the further sum of Fifty dollars yearly and every Year to my Daughter Mary Taylor during her natural life 4th I give and devise to my son William Osborn a lot of Ground situate in the Township of East Bradford reserving twelve feet along the line of Richard Strodes Land I also give and devise to my son William Osborn a lot of Ground situate in the Township of West-town which I exchanged with Richard Strode for an equal quantity I also give and devise to my son William Osborn about forty three and a half acres of Land situate in the Township of West-town lately surveyed by Joshua Weavers reserving a Cart Road nearly where it now goes near the top of the hill abt twelve feet along the line of Richard Strodes land to him his heirs and assigns for ever I also give and devise to my son William Osborn the sum of Thirteen hundred and Thirty three Dollars and Thirty three cents towards erecting Buildings on said tract. Part of said Legacy he has received with which he stands charged with. 5th

I give and devise unto my Daughter Mary Taylor the sum of fifty Dollars to be paid to her yearly and every Year during her natural life by my Son Samuel as mentioned in my devise to my said Son Samuel. 6th Item I give and devise to my Daughter Frances Strode the wife of Richard Strode the one half of all my lands situate on the West side of Susquehanna river to her heirs and assigns forever 7th I give and devise to my Daughter Hannah Green the wife of Joseph Green the sum of fourteen hundred Dollars to be paid by my Executor in one Year after my decease 8th I give and devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Beal the wife of William Beal the sum of fourteen hundred dollars to be paid by my Executor in one year after my decease 9th I give and devise to my Grandson Osborne Entrikin the sum of fourteen hundred dollars to be paid by my Executor when he arrives to the age Twenty one years 10th I Give and devise to my son Joseph Osborn and to his heirs and assigns forever all the residue and remainder of my Real and Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever or wheresoever found my said son paying all and singular the Legacies and Yearly Payments which is directed to be paid out of my Estate and not otherwise provided for in this my last Will and Testament and providing for my beloved Wife with all the Articles specified in my bequest to her all which Legacies and bequests to be out of the Land devised to him in the County of Chester and that my Land in the County of Newcastle and on the West side of Susquehanna River shall be held by my said Joseph Osborn and Francis Strode clear of any lien or incumbrance whatever the better to enable them to make a title for the same if they should be inclined to make sale thereof And Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my son Joseph Osborn to be my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all other Wills and Legacies and bequests by me heretofore made and declaring this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. IN WITNESS Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourth day of June in the Year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and Thirteen Peter Osborn  signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the Testator as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request having subscribed as Witnesses - The words interlined between the Sixtysecond and Sixtythird lines Wit. "hundred" were interlined before signing Samuel Entrikin William Davis Titus Taylor -

W^{ch} Chester May 23rd 1815 Then personally appeared Samuel Entrikin, William Davis and Titus Taylor, and the said Samuel on his solemn Oath, and the said William and Titus on their solemn Affirmation did respectively say on their several Qualifications that they were personally present and did see and hear Peter Osborn the Testator in the foregoing instrument of Writing named sign seal publish pronounce and declare the same as and for his last Will and Testament and that at the doing thereof he was of a sound and well disposing mind and memory to the best of their knowledge and belief

John Wilson of Londonderry Town-
ship County of Chester and State of Pennsylvania being
though weak in body of a sound disposing mind and memory do make
and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
following First I will and direct that all my Just debts be well and timely
paid after my decease by my Executors herein after named Item I Will
to my Wife Martha the sum of Eight hundred Dollars the residue
I Will to my six Children namely Sarah, James Mary Samuel
Hannah and Phebe equally to shares and parts alike to be paid to them
at the age of twenty one in good and lawfull money of the State aforesaid
further I will and direct that my Wife shall have the Stock and Farming
Attentials and other necessaries as she shall think proper for her use until the
first day of Aprile next and Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint
Martha my Wife whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth
day of May A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fourteen John Wilson
Signed sealed and acknowledged by the said John Wilson the Testator as his
last Will and Testament in the presence of us who subscribed our names
thereunto as Witnesses in his presences and at his request Elisha Baker
Aaron Baker Jun^r. West Chester May 28th 1814 Then personally ap-
peared Elisha Baker & Aaron Baker Jun^r. Who on their solemn affirmations respectively
did declare and say that they were personally present and did see and hear John
Wilson the Testator in the foregoing Instrument of Writing named sign seal & publish
(pronounce and declare the same as and for his last Will and Testament and
that at the doing thereof he was of a sound and well disposing mind and
memory to the best of their knowledge and belief
