And in case my executor sells said property he shall have the use of said money arising from the sale thereof and he shall give the said Molly such parts of it or the interest thereof as her support or living may require. And I do hereby make and ordain my esteemed friend Christopher Yonson executor of this my last will and Testament In Witness Whereof the said Susanna Smith the testator have to this my will written on one sheet of paper set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

I Ann Osborn of the Township of Guyrield in the County of Montgomery and state of Pennsylvania widow, being of sound and

disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void ^{all former} ~~any~~ wills by me at any time heretofore made in manner following that is to say.


First. I order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses together with the collateral inheritance tax that may be due from my estate be in the first place fully paid and satisfied by my executors

Secondly: I give and bequeath to my sister Catharine now the wife of John B. Garner and Mary daughter of my sister

Elizabeth now the wife of George Fitzgerald and Sophia and Sarah Ann daughter of my brother Valentine Fitzgerald all my wearing apparel to be divided equally in four shares amongst the said Catharine, Mary Sophia and Sarah Ann.

Thirdly: I order and direct that the remainders of my property and effects be sold at public vendue by my executor and the proceeds thereof together with all the remaining part or residue of my estate I give and bequeath to the following named persons to be divided equally amongst them in eight shares, share and share alike to wit to my five brothers William Fitzgerald Jacob Fitzgerald Thomas Fitzgerald Daniel Fitzgerald and Valentine Fitzgerald each one share, to the children of my deceased sister Elizabeth one share to be divided equally amongst them and to George May a young man formerly residing with me the remaining eighth share And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint Benjamin Hill Esq of the Borough of Norristown in the county and state aforesaid executor of this my last will and Testament

In Witness Whereof I the said Testator have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand and seal the eighth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine
