and kitchen furniture moneys Chattels and effects and generally all my Estate
Real personal and mixed whatsoever and wheresoever and of what nature kind
or quality soever to hold to her my said beloved wife Susan Kirby Osborne her heirs
Executors Administrators and Assigns absolutely forever.

nominate constitute and appoint my esteemed friend Daniel B. Smith
Druggist sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby
revoke Annul and make void all former and other Wills and Testaments
heretofore by me made and do declare this only to be my last Will and
