In the name of God, Amen, I Samuel Osborne of the township of York in the County of York & State of Pennsylvania farmer, being weak in body but of sound mind memory and understanding do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following to wit—

First—It is my will, and I do order that all my Just debts & funeral expenses be paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently can be after my decease—

Secondly— I give and bequeath all my estate real & personal to my brother Joseph Osborne & my niece Lotty Strain to be equally divided between them—

It is my will that my personal estate be equally divided by and between my said brother & said niece if they can agree to said division of it & retained by them, but if they can agree to the division of it, then it is to be sold in November next & the proceeds of the same equally divided between them—

I hereby authorize my executor herein after named to sell my real estate in eighteen hundred and forty one, unless they my said brother & niece agree to keep said estate longer, but when any disagreement takes place between my executor & my said niece in relation to said estate then my executor is to sell the same to the best advantage—

And lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my said brother Joseph, to be the executor of this my will, hereby revoking all other Wills, legacies & bequests by me heretofore made, & declaring this & no other to be my last Will and Testament,

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the thirty first day of July A.D. one thousand eight hundred & forty

In the name of God Amen I Sallomo Godfrey of Springfields township in the County of York and State of Pennsylvania being in Perfect state of health of body and of sound and disposing mind memory, and understanding blessed be God for the same Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my Last Will and Testament manner and form following that is to say -

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of the almighty God my Creator, and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Surviver Legatee and sole heir Elizabeth Brillhart who is to settle all my affairs and funeral charges and Expenses -

And then it is my will and I give and bequeath in fee simple all my Estate both real and personal whatsoever kind and nature the same may be unto Elizabeth Brillhart my faithful Companion and to her heirs and assigns for ever to hold and enjoy the same as her Estate and to dispose and bequeath the same as she thinks proper without giving any account or making any appraisement thereof unless occasioned for the collateral Tax
