and testament


First of all recommending my soul to Almighty god and my body to the  
Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner in Slate ridge grave yard by  
my Executor and as to what worldly estate it has pleased god to bless me with it is my will  
that it be disposed of in the following manner 1) It is my will that all my just debts  
and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate by my executor 2) The place on which  
I reside (containing thirty six acres I give and bequeath to my grand son Wm H.  
Osborn 3) unto my grand daughter Ann E. Osborn I give and bequeath three hundred  
dollars together with one bedstead and bedding one side saddle one Beauvoir one picture  
made by my self 4) unto my grand daughter Mary M. Osborn I give and bequeath the  
sum of three hundred dollars together with one dining table one chest one spinning wheel  
one looking Glass one yarn reel 5) unto my grand daughter Sarah A. Osborn I give

and bequeath the sum of four hundred dollars together one base Candle stick one  
 flax Hackle one Warming pan one set of tea spoons 5) Unto my three grand dau-  
 ghters I give and bequeath all my Bedclothes linings and all my Wearing ap-  
 parrel to be equally divided among them Together with all dishes milk pans and  
 cooking Affairs 6) Unto Ann E. Osborn I give and bequeath my metal Chest  
 7) Unto Mary M. Osborn I give one sink and my savel and tongs 8) Unto  
 my Grand son ~~Wm~~ H. Osborn I give one hundred and sixteen dollars  
 and sixteen cents Money left in my hands as Administrator of Jane Commill  
Deed if not paid out before my death together with one Corner Cupboard one  
 Wood box 9) And providing any of my above named grand Children should die  
 It is my Will that their share shall be equally divided among the rest that are living  
 10) And at my death if my grand son William H. Osborn is not of age I allow  
 the rent of my place to be Collected and put out at interest for the benefit of my above  
 named grand son And my Money in my Hands to be put out at interest at my  
 death by the Executor for the use of my grand Children 11) It is my Will my  
 grand daughter Mary M. Osborn shall have a bedstead equal in Value to the one  
 I gave to my Grand daughter Ann Elizabeth Osborn after my estate is settled  
 said bedstead is to be purchased before the rest gets their share and providing there  
 is Any thing left after my estate is settled it is to be divided among my three grand  
 Daughters 12) And lastly I do appoint William Torbert sr Executor of this  
 my last Will and testament hereby revoking any Will or Wills by me heretofore  
 made and appointing and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and testa-  
 ment in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal the thirtieth day  
 of September in the year of our lord Eighteen hundred and sixty four

In the name of God, Amen.  
I Elizabeth Adams of Town Township York County and state of Pennsylvania being in good health and of perfect mind and

memory thanks be unto God and calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and testament that is to say principally and first of all. I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God Who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at or in the Church yard at Quinton Church nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God, I give devise and bequeath in the following manner and form First, it is my Will that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid out my estate by my executor herein after named as soon as Convenient after my decease And I give and bequeath unto my brother John Groves four Children four hundred dollars in the following manner and sums 1<sup>st</sup> To my nephew William W. Grove, son of my brother John Grove I give and bequeath the sum of one hundred dollars 2<sup>nd</sup> To my niece Sarah E. Grove daughter of my brother John Grove I give and bequeath one hundred dollars 3<sup>rd</sup> To
