In the name of God amen I John Osborn of Accomack County being weak in body but in my wits since and memory thanks be to Almighty God calling mind my full Estate doe give and bequeath my Soul to Almighty God that Gave it my Body to be Dierly buried att the Discretion of my Executors or friends March Tenthth 1737 Item Give and bequeath unto my Wife Rachel Osborn all my Lands during her widowhood and after her widowhood my will is also that my wife have half my Lands her life time which part is where I now Live and also have Prevelidge in fort trees for what Timber she has a sasion of and after her death my will is that my eldest son Estell Osborn have all my Lands

To him and the Cars of his body lawfully begotten for
 Ever I give and bequeath my Negro whetney to my
 Wife During her Life and after her Death my will is that
 my son John Osborn have the said Negro I give and bequeath
 to my wife all my goods and Chattels During her Life time
 and after to be Equally divided between my three Children
 my will is that my wife Ratchal Osborn be my Executrix
 and George Duglafs my Executor I do allow this to be my
 Last will and testament as Witness my hand and Seal
 this tenth Day of March Anno Domini 1737
