The last will and Testament of John Morgan Dec<sup>d</sup> was Exhibited into Court and proved by the Oaths of Matthew Sandifer and William Morgan two of the Witnesses thereto Subscribed Sworn to by Simon Morgan and John Morgan Just<sup>s</sup> two of the Executors therein named and ordered to be Recorded and on the motion of the said Court who entered into and Acknowledged bond together with John Finny and William Morgan their Securities in the penalty of 1000 Dollars as the Law Directs Certificate is granted them for obtaining probate in due form.

Pursuant to an order of the worshipping Court of Amecia County we the Subscribers have laid of and accepted the slaves devised by William Osborne to his wife Elizabeth during her life agreeable to the last will and Testament of the said William Osborne in the following manner Viz to the Children of the said Osborne six Slaves to wit Bob. Lemon, Jim, Tom, Hannah, and Peter and the said Children to pay to Branch Osborne Esq<sup>r</sup> & to ~~John~~ <sup>John</sup> Osborne eight slaves to wit, Will, Matt, Sue, Nanny, Molly, Nancy, John, and Peggy and the said John Osborne to pay to Branch Osborne Esq<sup>r</sup> & to ~~John~~ <sup>John</sup> Osborne slaves to wit, Punch, Sauney, Roger, Fanny, Stephy, Pats and Jimny.
