Know all men by these presents, that We Thomas A Spears and Mark F Flournoy are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the sum of one thousand dollars; to the payment whereof We and truly to be made to the said Commonwealth, We bind ourselves and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally; firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 12th day of March A D. one thousand eight hundred and forty nine and in the 73rd year of the Commonwealth.

The Condition of the above obligations is, That if the said Thomas A Spears administrator of the goods, chattels and credits of Martha Osborne deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of him the said Thomas A Spears or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him; and the same so made do exhibit into the County Court of Blisfield County, where he shall be thereunto required by the said Court; and such goods, chattels and credits, do well and truly administer according to law; and further do make a just and true account of his doings and doing therein when thereunto required by the said Court; and all the rest of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administrator, the same being first examined and allowed by the justices of the said Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively, as are entitled to the same by law; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the deceased, and the same be proved in Court, and the executor obtain a certificate of probat thereof; and the said Thomas A Spears do in such case, being required, under and deliver up his letters of administration; then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force.

Signed, Sealed and delivered in the presence of the Court sitting, and ordered to be recorded.
