Robertson, Beasley, William Beasley, and Christopher Bafis was duly sworn before me. Given under my hands this 17th day of October 1805. *Arch. Walthall.*

At a Court held for Chesterfield county the 9th day of December 1805. This Inventory and appraisement of the estate of Mary Anne Munnally was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Boborne's Will

In the name of God amen, I Martha Field Boborne, of the county of Chesterfield do make and ordain this to be my last Will & Testament. I give to my son in law Benjamin Boborne what ever sum of money he may owe me at this time.

I give to my son in law Peter Field Archer whatever sum of money he may owe me at this time.

I give to the children of my daughter Elizabeth Archer at present born, or which she may hereafter have, one share God named Peter with her future increase, but it is my will my said daughter may have the benefit of the money arising from the hire of the said negro for the use of her and her children so long as she may live. I give my said daughter Elizabeth Archer my looking glass.

The remainder of my estate I desire may be sold, and the money as in my hands with the remainder of my estate after paying my debts. I give equally between the children of my two daughters Mary Boborne and Elizabeth Archer.

I appoint my friends George Mashham, John Archer, and Archibud Bafis my executors of this will. In witness whereof I have desist at my hands and seal this sixth day of November one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight.

At a Court held for Chesterfield county December 9th 1805. The last Will and Testament of Martha Field Boborne deceased, was presented in Court and proven by the oath of Jonas Robertson a subscribing witness, and the hand writing of John Mashham junr also a subscribing witness (now deceased) being sworn by the oath of the said Jonas, the said Will was ordered to be recorded.

In the motion of Archibud Bafis an executor therein named, who took the oath required by law, and entered into bonds with security, conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form.
