this my last will and testament, that is to say I wish my in-  
testate in the land of the Estate of my Grand Father George  
O'Brien do be sold and after paying all my last debts  
I give unto my son Willis Maddox entire all my estate &  
lastly appoint my friend Charles Anderson, my executor to be  
my last will and testament sign & sealed and witness  
this secondly day of February one thousand eight hundred  
and twenty six.

John Lenthin deponent with a certificate as the same might  
a certificate was granted to me for obtaining a duplicate

In the name of God Amen I Pamela Carrington of the  
County of Cumberland State of Virginia being of sound  
last will and testament.

In the first place I recommend my soul to God  
It is my wish that all my last debts paid as they may  
be due.

I give to my beloved wife Susan Carrington during her na-  
tural life, the plantation, on which I now reside, with a part  
of the crops & as much more as may be necessary for the sup-  
port of the plantation one year, also such a part of the stock  
of every kind, plantation utensils, household kitchen  
furniture as she may want, and I give to her during her  
natural life fifteen negroes, such as she may choose  
from my Estate.

I will that all the lands lying in the State of Ohio  
in which I am interested, both now by my Father Joseph  
Carrington, & all the property in which I have an inter-  
est in the Est. of David Carrington (decd) do come at  
the direction of my Executor.
