In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Williams of the Parish and County of Henrico being of perfect Mind and the
 sounder of the Mind do hereby make and give the following
 Testimony in and to the Court of Henrico County and to the
 Thomas Williams the outward Part of my Trust of Land which he
 and his heirs should be a binding line as follows
 little below his house at a marked black Oak tree crossing a plantation a straight course to a dead marked white Oak
 standing on the Edge of the Swamp and the
 the River running out of the said bounds above the
 is understood which nature of the said
 result for ever the
 of the said land

Comby to his Brother Edward and his heirs for ever during her life. Item I give to my Son Thomas Osborne a Trunk
 and furniture bested Co. &c. and a Trunk with a Chest and half dozen Napkins of B. and a box or two of Buttons, also my
 Devis and bequeath to my Son Edward Osborne the Lesser and remaining part of my Plantation where I was late living upon
 the standing line before mentioned between my Son Thomas and he and I also give him the greater part of land to be
 left before accepted in the bounds of the said plantation which the said land is bounded as followeth: beginning at the
 the mouth of a Run bottom so down the Run bottom to the Swamp thence along the Run to John Osborns line thence along
 John Osborns line to a pole and aft said standing in John Osborns pasture was made a Corner Tree thence from the said Corner Tree
 to a Black Oak thence along a Little path to a black Oak thence to a Striped thence down the Hill to a White Oak thence
 to the Hickory standing in the Bottom the place first begun of which said land so bounded & plantation is bound with all lands
 and buildings upon it and Richard five acres of Apples Trees only Excepted which I give unto my Son Thomas the five
 Rows next his house so long as he live the aforementioned Land I give to my said Son Edward to him and to the heirs of his
 body forever he gotten for ever. Item I give Devis and bequeath to my said Son Edward two hundred acres of land lying at
 Day Creek in Henrico County to him and his heirs for ever. Item I also give unto my said Son Edward my
 Negro Man Frank to him and to his heirs for ever. I also give my said Son Edward one Trunk best and furniture as it stands
 bested Co. &c. and Vallains bested Co. &c. Item I give to my Daughter Mary one Negro Woman named Amy to her
 the said Mary Branch and to her heirs for ever and in case she have any Issue my Will is her Daughter Mary Branch
 shall have the first Child and her Daughter Martha the second Child to be given them and their heirs for ever and my Will
 is further that my Daughter Mary shall pay yearly twenty shillings of Year towards the maintaining her Child yearly
 or forfeit the said Negro Amy to her Brother Thomas Osborne and to his heirs for ever and likewise my Will is that
 my Son Edward shall be liable to answer the same Penalty and forfeit the said Negro Frank to his Brother Thomas if
 he refuse to pay twenty shillings of year to the same use. I give to my Daughter Mary also a Chest of Drawers a
 Looking Glass and a Still Item I give unto my said daughter Mary a Trunk bested Co. &c. and furniture
 belonging to it a four foot Chest a small Trunk and all her mothers Cloths Item I give unto my Grand Daughter Martha
 Osborne a Negro Girl named Francis to be kept with her at the Age of Eighteen or Marriage to her the said Martha
 and to her heirs for ever. Item I give unto my Grand Daughter Martha one Trunk best and furniture and the Chest
 and Trunk that was my Daughter Elizabeths and whatever is now in them that belong to her Aunt, D. a black
 Walnut Chest and her Grand Mothers Gold Ring. Item I give unto John Green ten shillings Cash. Item all
 the Remainder and Residue of my Personal Estate Goods, Chattels, Debts due and Demands whatsoever I
 give I give to my two Sons Thomas Osborne and Edward Osborne to be divided equally among my said two Sons
 of this my last Will and Testament and to make good and collect the same by me hereafter made.
