I Edward Potts of Loudoun County do make this my last will &
Testament. I devise to my wife the dwelling house in which I now live
during her natural life together with the Garden the Spring House Smoke
House the use of fruit for her own use first word to be delivered at her door
a cow and pasturage and key for the same also seventy five dollars worth
of household and kitchen furniture to be taken by her at the appraisment
or purchased at the sale as she may prefer I also direct my executor
to pay to her during life thirty five dollars yearly in advanced
I direct my executor to make sale of the whole of my estate both
real and personal (except as before expressed) at such time or times

and in such portions as he may think most advantageous, but the part on which the dwelling house stands occupied by my wife I do not wish sold till her death, my family probably see best in three parcels, but this I leave to the discretion of my executor.

I desire the proceeds of the sale of my estate both real and personal to be divided into three equal parts, one third to be paid by my executor to my sister Betsey Osburn if living, if not, then to her children, if any of them be dead, living children the portion of such child to be given to my sister's grand children, one third part of my estate I give to the children of my deceased Niece Sally Gardner the first wife of Thomas Gardner of Jefferson County by and other third part I give to the children of my Nephew John Potts dead. Said portions to be paid over to them by my executor in money as the same shall from time to time come to hand or in bonds taking care that the same are well secured, the part of the farm connected with the dwelling house I wish sold at the death of my wife & in the mean time rented out by my executor in such manner as he may think best, the rent to go into the common fund for distribution as herein before provided. I discharge my colored man Benjamin from all further service at my death hereby giving him his absolute freedom.

I nominate as the executor of this my last will and Testament my friend James C. Jarney of Hillsborough. Witness my hand the 22^d of May 1845

At a Court held for Loudoun County 11th May 1846
 The last will and Testament of Edward Potts dead having been heretofore presented to the Court for probate, upon the motion of James C. Jarney which motion was arrested by Mary Seamon a bond Court being arranged between the parties that the motion of the said Jarney should be withdrawn to remove all questions as to the right of said Mary Seamon to contest said will as by a bill in Chancery filed for the purpose. It is ordered that the said motion be accordingly withdrawn together with the said will, and at another time afterwards to wit, on the day the said last will and Testament of Edward Potts dead was again presented to the Court by James C. Jarney, thereupon the same was proved by the oaths of James McShary Bushrod Osburn & T. V. B. Osburn the subscribing witnesses & thereunto ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of James C. Jarney the executor therein named who made affirmation as such & together with Joshua Osburn Andrew Copeland Nathan Neer and John Jarney his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty eight thousand dollars, conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.

I Peter Stuck of the County of Loudoun and State of Virginia make hereby my last will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say first I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after my decease except such as is hereinafter specially bequeathed & also the land and tenements I purchased of Jacob Hawley and wife be sold at the same time at public Auction on the following terms (to wit) one third of the purchase money to be paid at the time possession is given and the balance in two equal annual payments without interest, and out of the moneys arising therefrom my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
